Senate Bill 1132 Dies in the Senate:

Senate Bill 1132 died on the Senate floor on May 30th to a 16-16 vote. The bill would have put a moratorium on hydraulic fracturing. State Senator Holly Mitchell authored this bill and a similar measure, AB 1323, which failed to make it out of the Assembly committee.

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
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


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
